My child has thrived since starting this school. I can't thank everyone enough.

How genuinely the staff care about the students.

Integration of the preschool into "big school".

You are able to raise any issue and they are dealt with that day or responded to. Staff always welcoming.

It's underpinned by traditional values that have the children at heart. It is a community. All adults know pupils well. The staff to pupil ratios support development and enhance learning.

I like that the school is a small school and everyone knows everyone. It makes transitions into the next classroom a lot better/easier.

My child's teacher is fantastic who is always very welcoming to parents and children. It was lovely to see the teacher point out parents to children in the church at Christmas and making a point to say hi. Also very helpful to share learning on tapestry.

I really value how approachable and supportive the school is. Communication is always clear, and I feel that any concerns are listened to and taken seriously. There is a strong sense of mutual respect between staff, parents and children, which creates a positive environment. My child is happy and enjoys coming to school, which speaks volumes. I especially appreciate the support given for my child's additional needs and staff consistently go above and beyond to ensure he is included, encouraged and able to reach his full potential. It's clear that the wellbeing and development of every child is top priority.

How can we make Binbrook C of E Primary even better?

More regular information concerning progress with subjects (in addition to parent evenings).

More outdoor work (nature/animals).

A request for more homework

Potential for Class Dojo? A few issues getting uniform in good time.

Bring back old traditions like May Queen...encourage more children to look at sitting their 11+ exams and support the children who want to.

Not sure, maybe by adding a swimming pool or free bus service for the kids.

Too much homework for primary aged children!

Possibly more sporting events.

More school trips.

Not be a C of E school. Bring the community into school more – events etc. –use of school hall for fundraising events.

Give teachers more authority to punish!

Teachers/TAs have more knowledge on SEND children. With how to help them with their specific need.

Continue to develop the provision provided for pupils. Continue to develop provision for SEND ensuring inclusion and plans to reduce seclusion in line with new white paper outlines. More extra-curricular offers (trips specifically).

The school could invite parents into school more to play more of an active part in school life. E.g. invite parents in for a morning/afternoon to see what the children have been learning/doing on a topic. My children have enjoyed non-uniform days at school as this doesn't happen very often. It was very disappointing that we was never invited into preschool for our child leaving and starting in reception. There was nothing to acknowledge this big milestone – no graduation like previous years or a fun/trip day.

I am very happy with the school and the support it provides and I don't have any specific areas for improvement. The school is doing a fantastic job maintaining a nurturing, inclusive and supportive environment. Please continue the excellent work, particularly the strong communication with parents and the dedication to helping every child achieve their best.
